

Early Years Foundation Stage

The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum

The EYFS Framework explains how and what your child will be learning to support their healthy development.

Children should mostly develop the 3 prime areas first. These are:

- Communication and language;
- Physical development
- Personal, social and emotional development.

These prime areas are those most essential for your child's healthy development and future learning.



As children grow, the prime areas will help them to develop skills in 4 specific areas. These are:

- Literacy;
- Mathematics;
- Understanding the world; and
- Expressive arts and design.

These 7 areas are used to plan your child's learning and activities. We will always make sure that your son/daughter is supported with their learning and that the activities are suited to your child's unique needs.

Sing and tell nursery rhymes

Talk about the numbers, colours, words and letters you see when you are out and about

Allow your child to cut out and stick pictures from magazines

On a trip to the supermarket, talk about all the different packaging shapes



Cook / bake together

Plant seeds or bulbs in a pot or garden patch


Talk to your child at every opportunity – e.g. what you are doing that day

Use the weather – shadows, rain puddles, snow, wind, mist and sun – to extend your child's vocabulary


Share a book

Explore the park at a different time of the year – go off the beaten track

Read Write Inc.

- Read Write Inc. Phonics teaches children to read accurately and fluently with good comprehension. They learn to form each letter, spell correctly, and compose their ideas step-by step.
- In Reception at Eden Park, we match RWInc. sessions to suit your child's ability. Some children, who have attended our Frogs Nursery, will have been exposed to part of the RWInc. scheme before and we are aware that other children may not have.
- The scheme ensures that children are taught in small groups, in groups that match their ability.

Powermaths


- At Eden Park in Reception, we aim to offer and deliver high quality Maths opportunities and sessions to enable children to have a deep understanding of mathematical concepts.

Absence and Medical Information


Absence

- If your child is not attending school for any reason, please ring the school by 8:30am (**01803 855300**) and leave a message on the answerphone.


• If your child requires any medicine, we ask that you sign this in and out at Main Reception and fill in the necessary paper work.

Uniform can be purchased from LMOB situated in Brixham's high street.






- Our PE Kit is:
