The Powerful Knowledge we will take away from this Learning Enquiry (LE) (what we will be learning):

During this Learning Enquiry, the children will take a journey through different periods in time to consider the lives and careers of significant pioneers and explorers. Here are some key facts and knowledge that the children will know by the end of the LE:

- An explorer is a person who travels to or through an unfamiliar area to; learn about it, discuss, and examine it.
- A pioneer is one of the first to explore or settle in a new or unfamiliar area. A pioneer may also be the first to develop or apply a method, knowledge, or an activity.
- The age of exploration (the 15th-17th century) was when European countries sent people to discover new lands, find trade routes, seek treasure, and take over new places for their country. The world started to be mapped and different civilizations came in to contact with each other.
- Sir Francis Drake was an English explorer. He was the first Englishman to sail around the world.
- Neil Armstrong was an American Astronaut and on July 21st 1969 was the first man to walk on the moon.
- Amelia Earhart was an American Aviator. In 1928 she was the first woman to fly across the Atlantic Ocean as a navigator with a crew. In 1932 she did the flight solo. She disappeared in 1937 when attempting to be the first woman to fly around the world.

Explore Explorer Empire	To travel through an unfamiliar area in order to learn about it. A person who explores a new or unfamiliar area. A group of states or countries ruled by one monarch.
Pioneer Famous/significant person	Noun: a person who is among the first to explore or settle a new country or area. Verb: to develop or be the first to use or apply (a new method, area of knowledge, or activity). A person well known by many who has made a noteworthy or influential difference.
Travel	To move from one place to another, typically over a distance of some length.
Technology Education	The application of scientific knowledge for practical purposes. Machinery and equipment developed from the application of scientific knowledge. The process of teaching – typically through school.
Local National International	Relating or restricted to a particular area or one's neighbourhood. Relating a nation (a country). Existing, occurring, or carried on between nations (countries).
Historical Modern	Belonging to the past or concerning past events over a period of time. Relating to the present (now) or more recent times.
