

## Enriching the Curriculum Subject Offer

This document sets out the opportunities that the children at Eden Park (Y1-6) have had in the academic year **2021-2** to enrich the curriculum. It is worth noting that many of the activities found here are annual, as they are linked to the studies the year group completes and so will be repeated.

For the children at Eden Park, this enrichment takes two distinct forms:

**Extended opportunities:** These are times outside of the classroom where the children have had a chance to explore the subject in more detail, or in a more practical and hands on way than a classroom can provide.

**Enrichment activities:** Every week, the school runs “enrichment” where the children pick from a large range of activities and opportunities to enhance their learning. These sessions in many schools would be “after school clubs” but we value the participation of the children so highly at Eden Park that we have made this part of our timetabled offer for all children in Key Stage One and Two. Reception children join this later in an academic year as it requires movement across the site.
