British Values Democracy

In our History LE-Who was the Greatest Pioneer? - the children will understand how democracy has changed and that not everyone in the past who have had fair opportunities.

In History, - Who was the Greatest Pioneer? - the children will discuss Emmeline Pankhurst and her role in the Suffragettes for women's right to vote.

In our computing LE (Game Craze), the children will listen carefully to others and learn to compromise when working together in a team.

British Values Rule of Law

Children have strong links with the police and can participate in the 'mini police' scheme.

In our history LE - Who was the Greatest Pioneer?) - the children will understand why rules are important and how these have changed over time.

Reading 'Who let the Gods out', discusses right and wrong though various characters.

In our History LE - Who was the Greatest Pioneer? - the children will debate their opinions on Sir Francis Drake's behaviour and how this view has changed over time. E.g. slavery, stealing Spanish goods.

In e-safety, the children will learn that the rules and policies set in place when online are there to keep them safe.

In PE, we learn and understand the importance of following set rules.

Science 'Animals including Humans', the children will learn about making healthy lifestyle choices and how this can impact their life.

In our short Art and Design LE, the children will be able to consider the time and resources to plot a successful path towards a desired outcome.

In our DT LE 'Toy Story' the children are encouraged to manage risks when using equipment and work effectively towards a group goal.

In Art, DT and Music, er learn to express ourselves.

In Computing, we learn the importance of taking responsibility for our digital safety.

In PE, we consider the risks we need to manage when we learn a new sporting activity.

British Values Mutual Respect

In our Art and Design LE (There's no PLANet B), the children will understand the importance of recycling and looking after the environment beyond our school gates.

In our Ancient Greece LE (History), the children will learn that life is not the same for everyone and discuss the difference between then and now as well as different cultures.

In our Geography LE 'Eden Atlas', the children will explore different cultures and religions.

Writing, 'Are Humans Damaging the Atmosphere' the children will learn the impact of humans on the planet and how we can move to a more sustainable life.

Reading 'Goldfish Boy', the children will gain an understanding of mental health issues and how everyone isn't the same but deserves respect.

Reading 'Kid Normal' focusses on celebrating people's differences.
