

that is a national scheme being run by the council in the Bay to ensure that children have access to

food and activities over the school holiday periods. They will be delivering at least four hours per day for four days per week, one week in the Easter holiday period, four weeks in the summer holiday period and one week in the Christmas holiday period.

The primary aims of the programme are to reduce social isolation and 'holiday hunger' for children aged 5 to 16 years who are in receipt of benefits based free school meals.
