With my office being near Foundation, I am fortunate enough to see Read, Write Inc (our phonics programme) regularly and how hard they are working on their letter formation. They have come such a long way since the start of the year, I know everyone around them is so proud and quite rightly so.

Meanwhile down in Year 1, I walked in on the Butterflies and we discussed handwriting whilst looking at the names of the days of the week. They certainly knew about the importance of their ascending and descending letters. Impressive stuff.

One of my final stops was over to the Pastoral Team who were helping some of the children settle in calmly to the morning. One of the activities was a quick fire game. Under the category of something you use in sports, we had, tennis racket, tennis ball, football and legs. The categories changed quickly and the pupils really kept up!


