SPAG Skills Progression

Eden Park Primary School Academy

In order to ensure breadth and depth in SPAG:

- We teach SPAG objectives in discrete Skills Builders lessons from year 1 6. These lessons happen at least 3 times a week for 20 minutes.
- SPAG understanding and knowledge is also applied through writing as part of each LE. Best practice would incorporate discrete SPAG objectives from the half term into that T4W block, so that children can apply their new knowledge.
- If desired, an objective can be swapped with another within the year. Please inform literacy lead of any changes made.
- Skills Builders provides activities and tasks for the objectives, but other materials can be used as long as the objectives are covered.
- There are fewer objectives each term than the number of weeks, to enable teachers to use assessment to target children who have not achieved a specific objective during that term and to give more time to trickier objectives.
- Not all weekly blocks have a matching objective on the Coast Academy Framework for Writing. If they do, and are not covered as integrated skills, the number of the objective as it appears on CM is in brackets next to the topic. Objective numbers underlined are KPIs.

How to use the Skills Builders Materials:

- Plan in 3 or 4 discrete SPAG lessons.
- Start with the teacher's guide. Choose an activity or two from the 'possible teaching steps' section for the first couple of days.
- Use the pupil book and interactive activities. Peer coaching/sage and scribe/other co-operative structures could be used.
- End the week with the activity page completed independently from the teacher's guide. This can serve as an assessment against the CAF objective, to record on CM, where there is a relevant objective.

Weekly Spellings:

- A weekly spelling scheme has been produced, to link with the objectives on this progression ladder. These can be found in staff/curriculum/English/weekly spellings.
- Professional judgement should be used to adjust weekly spellings for SEND children. Start from their current writing band's common exception words.
